RSV Vaccine

About RSV: RSV is a respiratory virus that affects the airways and lungs. It often presents symptoms similar to a cold, such as a cough, sore throat, sneezing, and a runny or blocked nose. In severe cases, it can cause wheezing, shortness of breath, pneumonia, and other life-threatening conditions. While most infections resolve on their own, RSV can be particularly dangerous for older adults and those with underlying health conditions like heart or lung disease or a weakened immune system.

RSV in Children and Pregnant Women: RSV is common in young children but can be severe for infants and older adults. Therefore, the vaccine will also be offered to pregnant women starting from 28 weeks gestation.

Additional Vaccinations: The RSV vaccine is in addition to your annual seasonal influenza vaccine, which will be offered by the practice as usual.

This vaccine programme aims to protect those most vulnerable to RSV, ensuring better health outcomes for our community.
